



Our Speaker was **Cliff Buxton** from the American Red Cross, who spoke to us on emergency preparedness and disaster relief services. Cliff gave us some solid strategies on how to prepare ourselves in the event of a disaster such as an earthquake, and how appropriate given the recent emergency in South Napa. He stressed the importance of stocking supplies for the short term and the long term, including storing two weeks of water, plenty of batteries, food such as tuna, canned beans and noodles, and of course plenty of cash and toilet paper! Also make sure you always have plenty of gas in your car – a half a tank is now the new empty and it's always best to carry emergency equipment in your vehicle at all times.
